

CHAIRMANS REPORT

The irrigation and Extension Committee has had another year of building our capacity to deliver on our **Vision** of 'Working together for profitable and sustainable irrigated agriculture.' The **Mission** 'to support and enhance research and extension for continual improvement of irrigated agriculture' will be achieved through the five **Goals**:

- Promote new and existing research for irrigated agricultural systems
- Provide a network for irrigated research, development and extension
- Influence research and extension policy
- Be a recognised information hub for irrigated agriculture
- Provide a forum for irrigators to share new and innovative research ideas.

I would like to highlight that the areas IREC have made progress in have been determined largely by our Farmer 'members' and others attending our 'breakfast meetings'.

Key areas are

- Demonstration of current 'best practice' irrigation layouts
- Irrigation automation
- Nitrogen efficiency
- Use of animal manure for crop nutrition and soil amelioration
- Herbicide resistance/Spray Drift
- Crop rotations

Irrigators attendance at forum's, field days and workshops that IREC have run independently or in collaboration with the cotton and rice Industries and other grower groups, has been very good this year. The feedback we have received is extremely positive. Given our current outlook for the coming summer cropping season I urge you to take part in our IREC program this year.
