Irrigation discussion groups

With support from GRDC, IREC is running two irrigation discussion groups each based on a focus paddock.

The Coleambally group will look at end of season (flag leaf) nitrogen application, growth regulants and irrigation strategies and how these influence final yield and quality in durum wheat.

The Griffith group will look at growing barley in rotation with rice and mungbeans, while assessing the benefits of green manure crop in rotation with cotton.

Control options for fleabane and ryegrass

The 'Area wide management of weeds' project is focusing on the control of fleabane and glyphosateresistant ryegrass and progressing well.

Two trials are planned for 2020–21. The first will assess the impact that kikuyu on MI channel banks has on controlling the spread of fleabane and ryegrass onto neighbouring farms. The second will investigate different herbicides in the control of glyphosate-resistant ryegrass in citrus orchards.
